AWARDS OFFERED IN 2006

JAMIESON AWARD IN I/O PSYCHOLOGY

Established in 2006 in honour of Professor Bruce Jamieson of Canterbury University, **to recognise significant contributions to industrial/organisational psychology** in Aotearoa/New Zealand, through original research; dissemination of research and/or best practice; the sustained exemplary or innovative practice of I/O psychology; or through the organization, supervision and/or mentoring of others in the field of I/O psychology. Value: \$500.

HUNTER AWARD

Established in memory of Sir Thomas Hunter of Victoria University, this is an award of considerable distinction that aims **to recognise and encourage excellence in research in psychology**.

The recipient is invited to present the *Sir Thomas Hunter Lecture* at the NZPsS Conference in the year following the Award being made.

Value: \$500.

CJ ADCOCK AWARD

Established in 1990, in memory of Professor Cyril John Adcock of Victoria University. Its purpose is **to recognise the person who has made the most valuable and significant contribution to psychology in the past two years, in any of the following fields** of major interest to Professor Adcock: the philosophy of science; psychological theory; personality; cybernetics; cognition; perception; linguistics; and the use of multivariate statistical techniques. Value: \$250.

The Society's AWARDS are offered biennially to NZPsS Members (closing date 30th June).

AWARDS TO BE OFFERED IN 2007

PUBLIC INTEREST AWARD

This Award is made **in recognition of valuable contributions to Psychology in the public interest**. Areas in the public interest might include (but are not restricted to) minorities or oppressed groups, educational matters, social or community problems, unemployment, mental health, and psychological aspects of the law. Value: \$500.

GV GODDARD AWARD

An **early career award that recognises excellence in research in the areas of biopsychology, experimental psychology and neuropsychology**. Nominees should have held a PhD degree for no more than three years (but need not have been awarded the degree) at the time of nomination. Value: \$250.
